

Voters Who Require Assistance

2026 VOTER INFORMATION GUIDE



Voters who are disabled

- Any voter who requests assistance is entitled to receive it.
- Seniors and voters with disabilities can **go to the front of the line** when voting.
- Any voter may use the Ballot Marking Device.
- Voters with a print disability may request an **accessible ballot** at elections.ny.gov/request-ballot.
- Permanently ill and disabled voters can request an absentee ballot in perpetuity at elections.ny.gov/request-ballot



Non-English Speaking Voters

- May be entitled to receive assistance at the polls, including translated ballots and other election-related materials.
- **The following counties must provide language access services** during elections:
 - Bronx (Spanish)
 - Kings (Spanish, Mandarin and Cantonese)
 - Nassau (Spanish)
 - New York (Spanish, Mandarin and Cantonese)
 - Queens (Bengali, Mandarin, Cantonese, Spanish, and Korean)
 - Suffolk (Spanish)
 - Westchester (Spanish)
